# A word from the Chair

I hope you enjoyed reading our Summer 2014 edition of *The Rehabilitator* with details of this year's BWRC Symposium in association with South Of Scotland Wildlife Hospital at SRUC Barony Campus near Dumfries. If you need a reminder you can find the programme, booking form and other details in this mini-edition.

I count myself very fortunate this year because in August on holiday in the Lake District I was privileged to be able to observe one of the two surviving osprey chicks reared this year at Bassenthwaite Lake near Keswick. Chatting to Forestry Commission and RSPB staff and volunteers who assist visitors at the open air viewpoints in nearby Dodd Wood, I learned that the adult pair (a female known as KL and a male bird that has not been ringed) had hatched three eggs earlier this year, but that one of the three male chicks had died early on from an infection. The birds' activities were monitored by cameras above and to one side of the nest linked to screens at the Forestry Commission visitor centre at Whinlatter. The adult female rather curiously 'buried' the chick's body in their double-bed-sized nest of branches by covering it with grass - while very interesting behaviour, this was somewhat frustrating for the staff as they would have liked to recover the body and send it for post mortem examination!

Another chick (9A) survived the infection to fledge but hit a fence on an early flight and had to be recovered by a local farmer. When I learned that he has been sent to the Scottish SPCA's National Wildlife Rescue Centre near Stirling I smiled to myself – knowing that I might hear of his progress in the near future from one of this year's symposium speakers - Claire Fraser who works at the centre at Fishcross! Claire will be describing life during the first two years of the Scottish SPCA's new centre.

Extending our Symposium programme to one-and-a-half days for the first time this year has enabled to introduce a conference dinner in response to feedback from delegates at previous symposia who said they would like more opportunity to network with other delegates in this way. Barony Campus will provide us with the facilities to combine conference and more practical workshop style sessions over the weekend, as well as overnight accommodation in the student accommodation blocks, so we hope you'll join us for our conference dinner on the Saturday evening.

South of Scotland Wildlife Hospital have kindly organised evening entertainment from fabulous Scots bagpipe band 'Drums and Roses'. Tickets will be on sale during the conference on Saturday or if you'd like to book in advance please contact South of Scotland Wildlife Hospital (see details later in this newsletter).
